



TRANSPORT POLICY

Hambledon Cricket Club policy is that parents or other responsible adults are responsible for transporting players to and from all matches and practice sessions and therefore the Club will not be registering Private Vehicles for the transportation of individuals in connection with any fixtures or practice sessions arranged by the Club. The implementation of this policy is not intended to exclude any player from participation and parents/carers/guardians should contact the Club Welfare Officer if they have any problems with the transportation of players to matches or practice sessions.

DATA PROTECTION POLICY (GDPR)

Hambledon Cricket Club will use the information provided on this Membership Form (together with other information it obtains about the player) to administer his/her cricketing activity at the Club and in any activities in which he/she participates through the Club and to care for and supervise activities in which he/she is involved.

In some cases this may require the Club to disclose the information to County Boards, Leagues and to the England and Wales Cricket Board. In the event of a medical issue or child protection issue arising, the Club may disclose certain information to doctors or other medical specialists and/or to police, children's social care, the Courts and/or probation officers and, potentially to legal and other advisers involved in an investigation.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS

As a member of Hambledon Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- All Members agree not to disrupt training sessions or matches in any way. Any unacceptable behaviour will not be tolerated. Parents will be informed and further action taken if required.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and matches or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – Sports clothing (NO Jeans) – for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay membership fees promptly at the beginning of the season.
- All junior members under the age of 18 will wear helmets and boxes/abdominal/pelvic guards when batting or standing up to the wicket when wicket keeping.
- Members will respect all equipment and property, belonging to the club or other members.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club

premises or whilst representing the club.
