- Advise your coach in good time if you are going to be absent or late.
- Most of all, have fun! Work hard, always try your best and show a positive attitude.

Everyone at the club wants you to be safe and to enjoy yourself. All adults at the club who work with children are checked and vetted by the England and Wales Cricket Board. Whilst we hope you will be happy at the club, we understand that sometimes questions, concerns or difficulties may arise.
